Assessing for SELF-INJURY Risk

Not all questions need to be asked—remember to stay with the visitor and listen to what is happening for them!

Current Plan	Low	Medium	High
 Do they have a method in mind? Have they self-injured in the past? If yes, is this a new method? Are they self-injuring with the intention to die? (If yes, shift to Suicide Assessment) 			
Availability	Low	Medium	High
 Are they in a location/situation where they are able to self-injure? Do they have access to their method? 			
Lethality	Low	Medium	High
 How dangerous is their method? (can they self-injure safely?) Are they able to control the amount they self-injure? If they have already self-injured: is the injury still bleeding? How serious do they think the injury is? Have they taken care of their injury? 			
Resources	Low	Medium	High
 What distractions & coping tools do they have? Do they know how to care for their injuries (e.g. bandage their cuts)? If their injuries require extra medical care, are they willing and able to reach out for help (e.g. nurses hotline)? 			
Planning for Safety	Low	Medium	High
 What do they need to self-injure safely after the chat ends? Or, if they do not want to self-injure, to avoid self-injuring? Does anyone know about their self-injury and can they connect with that person for support? Will they reach out for help if their risk increases? 			
Overall Risk Assessment:	Low	Medium	High

SELF-INJURY Risk Levels

LOW	 Ambivalent about self-injuring Method is not lethal; can and will care for injuries May have or is open to other coping tools and distractions Willing and able to access additional care/safety plan
MEDIUM	 Has a strong desire to self-injure and/or has already self-injured Method is not lethal; can and will care for injuries May have other coping tools and distractions but is ambivalent about utilizing tools May be willing and able to access additional care/safety plan
HIGH	 Has a strong desire to self-injure and/or has already self-injured Method may be dangerous; is ambivalent about caring for injuries Lacks other coping tools and distractions and/or does not want to utilize tools Reluctant to access additional care/safety plan
IMMINENT	If the visitor has serious/life-threatening injuries we must send an emergency intervention. *Please let a Youthspace Staff person know immediately!*
